Factors include household size, monthly income, and if a member of your household is 60-years-old or older, or has a disability. The maximum gross monthly income is 130 percent of the federal poverty level, and the maximum net monthly income is 100 percent of the federal poverty level. For instance, if your household only consists of one person, then the gross monthly income to be eligible for SNAP is \$1,287 (net \$990).

The food stamps eligibility income limits are proportionate to the number of individuals who make up a household unit. Therefore, the breakdown is as follows: A household with only one person can qualify for SNAP if its gross monthly earnings total \$1,608 or less.

For example, in 2019, a family of three could receive a maximum benefit of \$505 if the state determined they had no income available to purchase food, but the average benefit for a household of three was an estimated \$365.

Families with no net income receive the maximum benefit, which is tied to the cost of the Department of Agriculture's Thrifty Food Plan (TFP), a diet plan intended to provide adequate nutrition at a minimal cost.
